I started studying for the LSAT in November 2018. I had no idea what on god's green earth what to do. Before I took the LSAT for the first time in March 2019, I did the Powerscore Logic Games Bible (I highly recommend), 7sage Core Curriculum (I also highly recommend), and took a Blueprint in-person course (not worth the money, will explain below). Before the March exam, I took five practice tests and put up 151, 152, 154, and 159. I got a 157 on the March exam.

Wanting to go to a T-25 school, obviously, I was discouraged. I found Jonathan on the 7sage approved tutors list and saw how highly regarded he was. I read literally every single of the testimonials that I am now contributing to. If you are reading this right now, odds are you are a highly motivated, intelligent person who is trying to dramatically improve your LSAT score. Depending on where you are in that process, you are possibly stressed, anxious, or depressed about the entire ordeal. Trust me, I get it.

I contacted Jonathan after the March exam and started working with him in mid-April. After two months, I was consistently scoring 165-166 and Blind Reviewing in the mid-170s.
